



Background

Yayasan Kusuma Buana (YKB), is a non-profit, non-governmental organization, was established at February 8, 1980 to strengthen the private sector's role in familyplanning, reproductive health care and community development through community services, research and health education. In conjunction with these goals, YKB serves as a resource and consultant for similar organization involved with family planning and reproductive health care issues.

YKB is a registered foundation under the Ministry of Justice which works in support of the national goal and in cooperation with the national family planning and health program in Indonesia.

Organization objective

The basic objectives of YKB are as follows:

- To develop and provide assistance in developing models for innovativematernal and child health care (including reproductive health care) service delivery to the people living in urban areas.
- To facilitate the integration of reproductive rights concept into family's lives in an effort to foster healthy Indonesia.
- To increase awareness, knowledge and practice of appropriate procedures for improving maternal and child health, birth spacing, adolescent health, HIV/AIDS prevention, communicable disease management, and nutritional improvement among community members.
- To demonstrate innovative approaches and strategies for theinstitutionalization of the "quality and healthy family" norm in support of the civil society concept.

YKB's core business is public health and early childhood education. In response to political and social changes in Indonesia, YKB has also been adding elements of civilsociety to their program. They have always addressed gender issues in their programming, as well as access to key services. YKB is one of Indonesia's oldestNGOs and has managed to thrive since 1980, even though it was founded at a time when NGOs received little trust from the government. They bring expertise inunderstanding the political and cultural context for social sustainability, as well as technical skills in the health field. In addition, as Indonesia has suffered natural disasters in the last five years, they have responded to the tsunami in Aceh and theearthquake in Yogyakarta, fielding teams to provide services, conducting evaluations of the UNFPA Emergency response in Aceh and participating in the rehabilitation and improvement of psycho-social needs of primary and high school age children inYogyakarta after the earthquake.

Organizational Structure

The foundation is governed by a board of Advisors, and is managed by the Executive Director who is responsible for daily coordination and supervision of YKB activities. YKB has a total of 76 staffs consist of 20 medics and paramedics, and 56 Non medics (sociologists, anthropologists, biologist, finance etc.).

YKB is divided into three primary branches,

Health Services

YKB opened its first clinics in 1982 in response to research indicating that low and middle incomes families living in urban areas were demanding an affordable good quality Family Planning and Maternal and Child Health services. YKB presently operates three self-sustain health clinics in densely populated areas inJakarta where middle and lower income families are residing. Twoo clinics are each located in North Jakarta and East Jakarta, one clinic is located in Rancaekek, Sumedang as a collaboration of YKB and Marks and Spencer (UK).

The clinics, staffed by trained midwives with back-up supervision provided by family doctors, obstetrician and gynecologist and pediatricians, offer comprehensive family health care including pre and post natal care, immunization, child care, reproductive tract infection including STDs and HIV/AIDS services, pap smear examinations, women's health services, and birthing facilities. Beside of clinic-based services, YKB has an extensive outreach services to the local community organizations (such as PKK/women's group, Quran recital groups, youth), schools (as part of the school health program to provide parasite control, anemia control and nutrition improvement), companies (as part of theAIDS and TB prevention, and FP services in the workplace) and entertainment venues (as part of the AIDS prevention program for commercial sex workers).





2 IEC and Training

YKB is committed to contributing to both the education of the vulnerable communities and families on issues of family planning, reproductive health (including HIV/AIDS and STI) and the environment as it relates to health care issues. YKB utilizes as variety of media including printed materials, seminars and electronic media.

YKB health team regularly conduct education focusing on a specific reproductive health issue such as intestinal worm infection, anemia and nutrition improvement, family planning, HIV/AIDS, Tuberculosis, women's health, maternal and child care, adolescent health care, pap smear and personal hygiene. These educationsessions are conducted to various communities and are usually neighborhood based, school based, factory based and organized in conjunction with local organizations and private companies.

YKB has initiated various community-based activities in Indramayu (used to be known as the origin of young prostitutes) to prevent human trafficking problems. These community-based activities covered the introduction of informal high school education, establishment of community-watch, adolescence reproductive health education through schools and community-based youth groups, training of youth friendly reproductive health services for health providers,

YKB also involved in the training of national and international health care professional and organizes seminars for groups such as health providers, schoolteacher, company managers and employees. YKB developed training program in management and self-reliance for NGO's in Indonesia and abroad.

YKB is involved in the development of pamphlets, booklets and posters focusing on a variety of reproductive health related topics ranging from family planningmethods to HIV/AIDS prevention to adolescent health. In addition YKB develops manuals and other tools to assist health care workers in the field.

YKB has been involved in the development of electronic media programs aimedat educating women and children about issues such as birth spacing, HIV/AIDS prevention, school parasite control and adolescent health.

Research and Evaluation

YKB conducts a variety of applied research and survey research projects in support of the family planning, maternal and child care, reproductive health care including HIV/AIDS and adolescent health delivery programs at YKB and in conjunction with a number of governmental and private organizations including private companies in Indonesia. YKB has dedicated research staff and financial staff who will be able to manage important program. YKB has been involved innational surveys, has done significant research in access and gender issues and performed qualitative surveys on numerous instances.

Projects have included improvement in quality of FP and RH care services, HIV/AIDS prevention activities, TB prevention activities, adolescent health care services, special groups such as school children, factory workers, commercial sex worker's health care deliveries and studies to determine effective approaches to encourage utilization of reproductive health care services by low and middle income groups living in urban areas.

Other activities

YKB has been active in the public health field for 39 years and health is a key aspect of social sustainability. YKB staffs have conducted gender assessments in Aceh post tsunami, their clients on a national level have been women, the urban poor and vulnerable groups. They have served as a mentor to other NGOs for transparent management practices and have a certification from Price Waterhouse as to their skills in fiscal management. Although they have not specialized in conflict areas, they have used mediation and public consultation to address divergent community demands in areas of Indonesia. They also have prior experience in post-reconstruction work in Yogyakarta.
